













Share of Ukrainian asylum seekers in most EU-member states is no more than 5%








There were maiden decisions only for 26% Ukrainian asylum applications








Only 4% of all Ukrainian asylum seekers in the EU received refugee status

*Number of first work permits for Ukrainians in 2014






Ukrainians were top labour migrants even before the conflict








Number of Ukrainians illegally-crossing the border between BCPs is low (2014, Q1-Q2 2015)
